# President's Report

It is with much pleasure that I report on the activities of the Avon Hockey Club in what was the 14<sup>th</sup> season for the club and my last at the helm as President. It has been another busy year for the club both off and on the field for the committee, the coaches and managers, the players and our families.

Our numbers continue to increase after the effects of the earthquakes Christchurch suffered and the impact is still being felt by the club particularly in our Junior playing numbers due to the large portion of the east being so devastatingly affected. We are again grateful for the relationship that we have with St Michael's School and thank in particular Mike Graveston for his tireless efforts in working with our Junior Club Captain, Katrina Morgan to make sure that is a strong working relationship and that the children continue to enjoy and learn our sport. Without Katrina and Mike things would not be where they are for juniors. The Junior Prizegiving was held at St Michael's School Hall as a separate event to the Senior Prizegiving. This enabled the coaches to have more time to tell their tales with pride about their wee players, and for the supporters in the crowd to see the joy as each player was presented with their certificates and the chests puff on those who received the special awards.

It is always a pleasure to see the children playing on Saturday's and to see the improvement in skills and understanding of how to play the game from the season start to the season end. I am lucky that I don't spend Saturday mornings at home and have the chance to visit a fair number of hockey turfs and see our junior teams in action, while trailing along after my children. One of the highlights for the Juniors was the committee organising, with Canterbury Hockey, to have a "Club Day" at Nunweek Park, albeit late in the season. Our 11-a-side teams played one after the other and our Prem teams had times that meant they could come down and watch the juniors play their matches. The Prem players were encouraged to help warm up the junior players and give a bit of a pep talk before the match. The committee put on a BBQ for the players and parents, Hellers (through Nick Harris) kindly donated the sausages and the sun was shining – count that as a success. We will definitely do it again but earlier in the season and try to organise that all the junior teams come and visit the main turfs and watch the older teams play. We just need the weather to cooperate with us!!!

Our major challenge for our juniors is turf availability for weekly trainings. We try hard each year to get time at Marist Park, as it is logistically the park of choice for our Juniors to train on, particularly the 11-a-side teams as they need to gain the concept of the size of the field and develop the strength and fitness required to compete against the opposition teams who do have the opportunities of full size turf practices. We are mindful of making it easy for our families hence the desire to be at Marist Park, not Nunweek Park in an effort to lessen travel times. Time is also limited for our smaller teams at Shirley Boys High School as we compete with Shirley Boys, Carlton Redcliffs, Avonside Girls High and Marion College for time on the turf after school.

On the Senior front 2014 saw the CPL Men take the field without club stalwart Steve Edwards who has been one of our longest serving Premier players of all time. There was a great spread of age and experience in the team for 2014 having attracted some lads from St Andrew's College to join the more experienced gentlemen. The team was coached by Rob Buhler who was unable to play for the early part of the season due to injury. Errol Staples also stepped into the coaching role when Rob was ready to take the field. The culture of the team was pleasing to see and the club were well

represented by these gentlemen throughout the season. Though the results on the points table were not what the players wanted for the season, there is a great base to carry on for 2015. The gentlemen were instrumental in the design of their new playing uniform and we wish to acknowledge the sponsorship of Parks Garage Ltd that assisted in the supply of the uniform.

The CPL Women also were disappointed with their standings for the season but they too had a great culture on and off the field and had a never die attitude that will also carry them well for the coming season. They had some great tight games and gave the star teams all a fright during the season and the opposition learnt to not take our ladies lightly. They are a young team with many of the players having come through the age grades with the club and I thank them for their loyalty. There are some great talented young women to carry the team through to 2015 and they will continue to develop and grow as a team. The team was coached by Anna Morgan and Ata de Goldi was her able assistant.

There was a great relationship between the Premier Men's and Women's team for the 2014 season. From what I hear there were a great number of social get togethers on Saturday evenings at the Carlton for "aftermatch" analysis.

Our Division 1 Mens team had a competitive season, winning the Div 2 South Island Super Six and only just missing out on a top 4 finish in the main competition. They struggled without a permanent keeper once Rob Gillespie was selected for the CPL Men for the season and he helped out as much as he could before it took too much of a toll on his body. There was a shortage of goalies in 2014 that meant we could not find a "legal" replacement until it was too late, despite our best efforts. We thank Bill Reimer from Carlton Redcliffs MWKO Men for assisting us, and Jon O'Haire for finishing the season with the team. It was noticeable to see that there was a good improvement in fitness for the team and it certainly made a difference for the boys. No official coach was in place but they managed themselves well and our thanks to Kathryn Bolton for being there week in and week out (practices as well) getting them organised. They were an entertaining team to watch scoring some fantastic goals and they have a great base to work from for the 2015 season.

The Division 1 Women's team had a slow start with several new players to the team and once the structure and style of play was understood by the complete team the results improved greatly. It was a team of varying ages and it is good to see the youth mixing well with the more "experienced" players and it certainly makes it harder for the opposition teams to completely read the game that the team played. Turnouts to practice were greatly affected by the Secondary School Girls competition being played on the night that the team trained and as a result the turnouts were not always what the coach and players would have liked. It was pleasing to see the improvement in the team from start to end. Paul Bamford again coached the team and was assisted by Issy Thomson towards the end of the season.

Our Division 2 Women's team was a young team who were coached again by Nigel Iggo. Nigel worked hard to bring more players to the team as player movement within the club left them a bit short before the season started. They had a pretty rugged start to the season against Rangiora with a fair amount of goals being put passed them but the next time they played them they really gave the Rangiora team a fright and only lost by 1 goal. They were a hard working team and their efforts were rewarded by the results that they achieved as the season went on.

The success story of the club was the Mid Week Open Women's team. Winners of the Championship round, finishing first with equal points to Hornby but having a far superior goal

difference meaning a 1<sup>st</sup> place. They went on to win the Porritt Cup Divison 1 section which was played at the end of the season. This was a very experienced team with a mixture of ages but definitely one with more "experienced" players and were well organised by Robin Cox. The Club congratulates them on their success and are proud of their achievements.

Avon again had two mens Mid Week Open teams with the Blue team finishing in 3<sup>rd</sup> place with nine wins and 2 losses and the Gold team 8<sup>th</sup> in a 12 team competition. The grade was then split into three sections based on places for Porritt Cup, the Blue team finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in Section 1 and the Gold team 4<sup>th</sup> in Section 2. These teams are both self managed and we thank them for taking the responsibility of organising themselves each week. Our priority for our Men's teams is new uniforms and some more volunteers to manage the teams. Our thanks to Tony McDonald who was responsible for the Blue team and to Les Smith for the Gold team.

Our Grass teams also had a great "aftermatch" environment between the Men and Womens teams which is good to see. These teams are the bones of the club and their players have been with our club for a good many years and have contributed much over the seasons. The Men's competition has seen growth with eight teams and the Women are down to four teams now and as a result they all know each other and their quirks!! They are self managed teams too and we would like to acknowledge the players who take on the responsibility of organising these teams.

Our Senior Prizegiving was again held at the Linfield Clubrooms and was well supported. This is a great opportunity to recognise the efforts of the teams and acknowledge our Prize Winners for each team and the Supreme Prize Winners. This is our main function of the season and we will look to make changes and improvements to how we run the evening.

Our congratulations to the players, coaches and managers who gained selection into representative teams, regionally and nationally. We had U18 representative players and coaches, U21 representative players, Senior Canterbury players, National League representative players and a fair number of our members playing, coaching and managing for regional and national representative Masters teams.

I must take the opportunity here to make special mention of Sarah Walcott and Jackie Eden from our CPL Women's team who were both selected to play for the Junior Black Sticks Women's team at a tournament held in the Gold Coast, Australia in December of 2014. NZ Hockey's selection policy for this team is that players who have been identified as having the potential to be a Black Stick within 3-5 years are being selected. This is something that we are very proud of and wish the girls continued success at this level for 2015. What is great to know is that Sarah has been with us since she was a wee tot at 5 years old! This is what the Avon Hockey Club is about and we look forward to tracking both Sarah and Jackie's rise up the Black Stick ranks.

We had another successful Quiz night at Robbies Elmwood and I thank everyone who attended. These are always a great night and are a good chance for the club members to have a get together and test their knowledge against each other and for us to do a wee bit of fundraising! To those who donate the prizes for the raffle we very much appreciate the items.

Lastly my thanks to the committee who have worked tirelessly throughout the season behind the scenes so that you can play the game that we all love. Many of the committee have other responsibilities within the club as coaches and managers and they give their time to you so that playing your game can happen each week. Some of them may forget where they live during winter!!!

We are in a much stronger financial position thanks to our Kurt Gurden, our Treasurer who has worked hard getting the playing subscriptions from each of you, attaining a 96% collection rate at February 2015 and he has worked well with Thea Mickell services to attain funding monies. We try to keep our player subscriptions as low as we can but as you know it is an expensive sport to play and the majority of the fees are paid to CHA and NZ Hockey. Kurt has spent a great deal of time, along with Rob Gillespie, looking at what it costs each of our teams to play for the season and what our income is from each team to cover these costs. The importance of funding and sponsorship gets greater each year and if you know of any sponsors who may be interested in Avon, please let us know.

We look forward to the 2015 season as we continue to grow financially, in playing numbers and strength. Tanyia Legge, President

# Treasurer's Report

2014 was my second year in charge of the numbers, and while it is an enjoyable job for a boring accountant like myself, the job certainly didn't get any easier! From a financial perspective, 2014 represented a reasonably stable year for the club both operationally and cash-flow wise. It was the first year that the club was able to fully utilise its new accounting system, Xero, which was in the process of setup in the prior season. Both myself and the committee now have a clean, up-to-date, easy to use accounting system that meets our needs. All invoicing was completed out of Xero, which allowed us to track debtors easily and the result was a significantly improved debtor collection time.

Financially, it was an interesting year for the club. The Statement of Financial Performance shows a net profit of \$7,043. While this may look good, the reality is that \$6,216 of this profit related to the finalisation of a prior year grant which could not be recognised as income in the prior year, and resulted in no cash inflow in 2014. The club received grants from the Christchurch City Council and Pub Charity at the start of the financial year. We are very grateful to these funders for their support. The club also lodged funding applications with the New Zealand Community Trust for turf and match fees, and the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Trust (CERT) for funding for new uniforms. These were unfortunately declined, however it is our intention to re-apply for new uniforms at the start of 2015.

Looking forward, the club has been proactive and lodged funding applications with the Canterbury Community Trust and Pub Charity to fund 2015 turf and match fees and equipment costs. I am happy to report that Pub Charity has approved \$5,000 towards these costs. Once again, we thank Pub Charity for their amazing support of our club. While this is a great start, we still need support from another funder to get through the year, as we burned through significant cash reserves in 2014. After factoring in the collection of all subs only, the club needs to make up a \$15,000 shortfall annually from other sources – hockey is not a cheap sport to play and we make losses on all of our subs that we charge! This is why it is important for all members to get involved in club fundraisers and activities as they arise. We will also consider providing sponsorship opportunities, such as team naming rights , advertising rights etc. to potential businesses to assist the club's cashflow.

I would like to say a massive thank you to Rob Gillespie who has assisted me with the treasurer duties all year and Robin Cox who has also assisted in chasing subs also.

#### **1 Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### **Accounts Receivable**

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realisable value.

#### Grants

Grants received are recognised in operating revenue unless specific conditions are attached to a grant and repayment of the grant is required where these conditions are not met. In these cases, the grant is treated as a liability until the conditions are met.

#### **Goods and Services Tax**

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

#### **Plant, Property and Equipment**

Property, Plant and Equipment are recognised at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation rates are disclosed in the asset schedule.

#### Taxation

The club meets the tax exemptions of section CW 46 in the Income Tax Act 2007 and therefore is not subject to payment of income tax.

#### **Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.
