President's Report

I am pleased to report on the activities of the Avon Hockey Club in 2018 being the 18th season for the club.

The Junior club continues to thrive in partnership with St Michael's School. Our playing numbers of children continue to grow at the entry end of our game. In 2018 we had 128 junior club members being an increase of approximately 10% on the previous season. This is indicative of the popularity of our game. However, with the growth comes the pressures of finding enough coaches, providing uniforms and equipment and encouraging enough umpires to officiate at the games. Hugh Williams, who lead our Junior Club in 2018, and was ably assisted by Kurt Gurden and Michael Graveston, does a fantastic job in organising and resourcing the many Junior teams and players. A huge thank you to Hugh who was recipient of the Club Person of the Year award in recognition of what an awesome job he and his supporters did in 2018. Also, a huge thanks to all the parents for their support throughout the season and the enthusiastic group of great young coaches that run the practices and game time for the teams. We can always use more support in this area so if there are any members or parents keen to be involved with coaching or managing a junior side please let Hugh, Kurt or Michael know.

Having recently had the opportunity to watch live International hockey in our city I ask myself who out of these our Junior players will go on in our game to the highest level after receiving such a strong beginning. Hockey can provide the young players many exciting opportunities in the years ahead, travelling and playing in tournaments through schools and representative sides and friendships made for life. Thank you to all those involved in our junior section; from players and parents through to the wonderful coaching volunteers, you were all a credit to the Avon Hockey Club in 2018. Congratulations to those chosen for representative teams in 2018; Vivek Lallu, Alex Brandrick, Ben Murphy, Raj Ravji, Duncan Fletcher, Finn McCormack-Young, Jono Murphy, Marcus Elson, Jake Patterson and Zoe Marino. Keep up the great efforts, all of you.

In the Senior section our club entered another new team in 2018, a second Youth men's team in Division 3 who became an instant success in winning their grade. We had 216 registered players in 2018 up from 204 in 2017 being 6% growth. In the men's competitions we had CPL, Division 1, two Mid-week sides a Grass team, and two Youth Division 3 teams. In the women's competitions we entered CPL, Division 1, Division 2, Division 3, Mid-week and a Grass team. From seven Men's teams we had three make the finals. Both Division 3 Youth teams made their respective finals as did the famed Grass Men's side attempt to defend their title, however the new Youth Blue Team was the only one to achieve glory and win their competition.

A number of our senior members achieved higher honours in 2018 by gaining selection into representative teams. Bella Forbes, Zoe Pullar played for the Barracudas with Olivia Amey playing Under 21's and Mikeely Jones playing at the Under 18 Association level. Ari Barrow, Levi Barrow, Rob Buhler played for the Beavers team with Tom Brown playing Under 21's and Harrison Darling, Sam Armitage playing Under 18 Regional's. Lewis Edmond played for the Under 18 Association team, Archie Batchelor, Shahid Ali and Hamish Newstead all playing Under 15 A's with Liam Alexander, Logan Cartwright-Keast, Rihan Lallu playing Under 15 B's. Congratulations to all these Avon members who represented Canterbury in 2018 and the Avon coaches who made themselves available to assist with the development of these representative players being Joe Piggott, Daniel McBride and Kurt Gurden.

I would like to thank the committee who worked hard to enable the smooth running of the 2018 season. A special mention goes to Hugh Williams who was awarded the Ross Gillespie Trophy in 2018 for his outstanding contribution to the club. We have a very capable group of volunteers that make this club function but we are always on the lookout for more help. If you cannot commit to the committee please commit to assisting wherever possible or just make things as easy as possible for those trying to get a job done. We need people to step up as coaches or managers as our club grows so please come forward if this is something that may interest you. Special mention to Robin Cox for all the secretarial work to keep the club functioning and essential to our club's health is a solid set of books and good control of the cash flows, so again big thanks must go to Kurt Gurden as Treasurer who manages our finances wherever he is in the world. Our financial position has remained positive over the year in an ever-tougher funding environment. A huge thank you to our sponsors and the charitable trusts that do support us, and we should look to support them in return if at all possible throughout the year: Hair Art & Beauty, Helloworld Travel Fendalton, Orbit Protect, and Archgola North Canterbury should all be high in your priority services lists.

I will again promote my aim from previous years for Avon to be the Club of choice. We have seen a 2018 season close with fantastic numbers at the prize giving dinner and again enjoyed some good social evenings at quiz nights. I experienced from the side lines a season that carried with it a lot of enjoyment, teamwork and competitive spirit by members throughout their respective teams and competitions. My goal for Avon Hockey Club to be recognised as the most enjoyable club to play for starts with our conduct, and our supporters conduct, off the field; being positive right through to the detail of communication among team mates around all facets of our sport, on-field, off-field, at training or in a social environment. I expect players to compete hard but play fair, to be restrained in any comments to officials and be respectful towards other players. I firmly believe winners are grinners but also we need to remember why we play the game, ultimately it must be because we enjoy it, win or lose. Please front up in 2019 hungry for the competition but with wide smiles and lots of positivity, be welcoming to new members, always play the game in good spirit and let's be noticed by the Canterbury community as the club whose players get the most reward from our sport irrespective of the individual match results. Thank you all for your contributions to Avon Hockey Club life in 2018 and I look forward to a positive and even more enjoyable 2019 season.

Treasurer's Report

Another year rolls by at the club and the 2018 year was a positive year financially. For me personally, it was a unique year in that I completed the first 7 months of the financial year as Treasurer from the ski slopes of Canada. While some distance away, it was surprisingly easier from over there in that you don't have to deal with the fast paced distractions of the work and hockey world back in Christchurch!

The club had a good year in obtaining grant funding and new sponsorship. We are very thankful to helloWorld Fendalton (owned by Bridget and Glenn Hanrahan) who came on board as sponsors of our CPL Men's team supplying them with a brand new uniform design. We are also very thankful of H&B Hair Salon (owned by Carla Thompson) for her continued support of our CPL Women's team, with H&B also sponsoring new uniforms for the ladies. Orbit Protect (owned by Wayne Stewart and Lee-Bin Tee) provided large sponsorship to the club to put our new Division 3 Men's Platinum team in new uniforms also. Archgola North Canterbury (owned by Grant and Renee Stewart) sponsored brand new bags for the junior. We are hugely appreciative for all the support we have received from these sponsors and we thank you so much for your support.

We also wish to thank the Lion Foundation, Pub Charity, and the Rata foundation for providing \$5,000 grants each towards our turf and match fees. Given how expensive hockey is to play, we are appreciative of the support from our grant funders, as without their support, we would either have to increase our subs by 25% per player, or not continue to operate.

Cash wise, we did increase our cash position by just under \$4,000 which was pleasing. As we add more teams to the competition, this increases the losses we have to fund for so it was pleasing to hold a good cash position. Our current cash position would allow us to operate for two years without grant funding. While a positive position to be in, it is also a bit worrying given the issues faced by our grant funders who receive their funding from gaming proceeds, an industry where problem gambling is being more and more scrutinised. It is a very difficult setting the subs each year having to assume the possibility of little grant funding which only leaves the possibility of increasing subs. It is therefore very important that club members get heavily involved in fundraising efforts so we can grow our revenue streams from other sources.

Looking towards the 2019 season, we are planning well financially with 2 grants submitted in February 2019 – one to NZCT for new junior uniforms and one to Lion Foundation to support turf and match fees. We will also put applications in to two further funders over the next month or so to further support the club costs. Our subs will also increase by \$5-10 each grade as CHA an Hockey NZ increase their fees by the CPI margin. We will also again reward our early payers with a early payment discount for paying on time. Please support the club by paying your fees on time – remember that your subs only cover about 75% of the costs we incur, meaning we as a committee have to go out and find the difference.

I want to thank the continued support of the Avon Hockey committee who work tirelessly behind the scenes for our members to make our club the club of choice to play for. Here's to a great 2019 hockey season!

Junior Club Co-ordinator's Report

Thank you to all our young players, parents, coaches, managers, umpires, umpire mentors, and score-keeper for an excellent 2018 season! This was a tough season for me as the new Junior Club Co-ordinator (and coach of three teams!) following the resignation of Michael Graveston. Thank you, Michael, for your many years of service in this role, and thank you for your continued support.

2018 Teams

We have seen some growth in our Junior Club this year. This was partly due to Cathedral Grammar disestablishing its Saturday hockey programme. Thanks to the efforts of Terry Thompson we were able to keep an entire squad of boys together. We had in total 124 junior members. This included a Fun Stick programme, two Mini Stick teams, four Kiwi Stick teams, and five Kwik Stick 11 a-side teams. Because a considerable proportion of the club was in the Kwik Stick grade this year, we have actually seen a reduction in the number of teams. This alleviated some of the pressure of finding coaches, but it made finding a sufficient number of larger uniforms difficult. Practices have been held on Thursday nights at Shirley Boys' High School. We managed to fit all our teams in a four hour slot between 4:30-8:30pm. This was certainly a challenge for the Kwik Stick girls who had the latest slot between 7:30-8:30pm, but hopefully we may find a better solution following the construction of more turfs in Christchurch.

Representative Programmes

Congratulations to the following boys and girls who were selected for Canterbury Representative teams this year: Vivek Lallu made the Hatch Cup team; Alex Brandrick, Benjamin Murphy, and Raj Ravji made the Canterbury B Boys; Marcus Elson, Duncan Fletcher, Zoe Marino, Finn McCormack-Young, Jonathan Murphy, and Jake Patterson were all selected for the Canterbury Development Programme.

Congratulations must also go to our very own Kurt Gurden who was selected Head Coach of the Hatch Cup team, and to Darren Patterson who was one of the coaches selected for the Canterbury Development Programme.

Umpiring

This year we have continued our umpiring programme at Cathedral Grammar. This year saw us join forces with HSOB/Burnside. This greatly expanded the pool of umpires available, and consequently reduced some of the organisational stress. A group of committed Avon members have been mentoring each week our group of young umpires. We are starting to see now the success of the programme as the small group that went through it is now having a major impact in the Kwik Stick grade -as well as in summer hockey. We are looking forward to continuing and improving this programme.

Summer Hockey

Summer hockey has been a massive success this 2018/2019 Summer. We had 95 registrations before Christmas and we currently have 65 registrations in the post-Christmas round.

Our Coaches

Coaches are the key to a successful club, and so we are extremely grateful for the service of our coaches in 2018. Of our 23 coaches, we had 7 new coaches: Cole Smith who assisted the Kwik Stick Swans; Ashleigh Willis who assisted the Kiwi Stick Blitz; Tania Dons who assisted the Kiwi Stick Wondergirls; Paula Winsor who ran the Fun Stick programme; Billy Knight and Ben Cox who assisted Paula; and John Graveston who coached the goalkeepers.

We have a mix of highly skilled and experienced coaches, and younger coaches with great potential. A major priority of ours in 2019 and beyond -shared with CHA and Hockey NZ -will be to look for ways in which we can support our coaches better, and keep them developing.

A big thank you must go to the Avon Committee for their continued support of the Junior Club. A massive thank you must also go to Grant and Renay Stewart from Archgola Canterbury North who generously sponsored us new coaching bags.

Looking Ahead

We will shortly be advertising for our 2019 season. There have been some complications in that CHA is still making some final season adjustments to make the most of the two new Nga Puna Wai turfs, and because Shirley Boys' High School are moving across to its new site at the beginning of the hockey season. Nevertheless, we hope to be up and rolling mid-March.

As mentioned already, one of our major priorities this season will be our coaches. Good coaching is what will keep our young players happy and improving.

Club Objectives

The objectives of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated are:

- b) To provide and service hockey programs to the local and adjoining communities.
- c) To ensure that best health and safety policies and practices are promoted and complied with.
- d) To make hockey an accessible competitive or recreational option for all persons regardless of gender, age, race or religion.
- e) To affiliate with the Canterbury Hockey Association (Inc).
- f) To provide social activities for its members.
- g) To undertake all things that are incidental to achieving these objectives.

Club Structure

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is comprised of a committee of 12 voluntary persons, including key positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Men's/Women's/Junior Club Captains, with all other positions being general committee positions. The club operates with the assistance of volunteer coaches and managers.

The Club operates under two divisions, being senior and junior club. The senior club operates under the oversight of the committee and offers hockey in both men's and women's grades as well as youth grade. The junior division also acts under the oversight of the committee and junior club captain. Hockey is offered to all junior players. The junior division operates in partnership with St. Michael's Church School.

Main Sources and Methods to Obtain Cash and Resources

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated's main sources of cash are from the receipt of player subscriptions, grant funding from local organisations, sponsorship, fundraising – primarily from pub quizzes and junior chocolate fundraisers, and other sundry sources.

Entity's Reliance on Volunteers and Donated Goods and Services

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is reliant on volunteers to operate the club and its teams. The Club currently employs no persons to assist with its operation. The Club receives very few donated goods from other persons or parties.

Statement of service performance for the year ended 31 October 2018

Description of Entity's Outcomes

The club participates in a performance programme which is run by Canterbury Hockey. The programme assesses a club's ability to meet certain performance objectives. Categories include; strategic planning for success, looking after volunteers, growing our club, developing our coaches, developing our umpires, playing the game, our facilities/equipment, looking after our members.

Clubmark accreditation has three different levels – gold, silver, and bronze. The higher the level achieved, the better a club has demonstrated their ability to meet the KPIs set out as part of the programme. Avon Hockey achieved a "Silver" status which is a strong score considering only five out of eleven clubs achieved any Clubmark accreditation.

1 Statement of Accounting Policies

This is the performance report of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated. The club is an incorporated society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 by a deed dated 22 May 2001.

The Club has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the performance report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The performance report is prepared on the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Measurement System

This performance report has been prepared on a historical cost basis. The performance report is presented in New Zealand dollars (NZ\$).

Particular Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the club in the preparation of this performance report.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realisable value.

Grants

Grants received are recognised in operating revenue unless specific conditions are attached to a grant and repayment of the grant is required where these conditions are not met. In these cases, the grant is treated as a liability until the conditions are met.

Goods and Services Tax

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

Plant, Property and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are recognised at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation rates are disclosed in the asset schedule.

Taxation

The club meets the tax exemptions of section CW 46 in the Income Tax Act 2007 and therefore is not subject to payment of income tax.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

A review of the performance report in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 is a limited assurance engagement. The assurance practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries, primarily of those responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on the performance report.

Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner, we have no relationship with, or interests in, the Club.

Other information in the Performance Report


