President's Report

I am pleased to report on the activities of the Avon Hockey Club in 2019 being the 19th season for the club.

The Junior club in partnership with St Michael's School had a strong year for results with a record number of players achieving representative honours. In 2019 we had 114 junior club members, so it was again a busy season for organising the teams, trainings and game days. There was quite a bubble of players in year 8 so 2020 will require rebuilding of numbers of children at the entry end of our game. Hugh Williams, who led our Junior Club in 2019, was ably assisted by Kurt Gurden and Michael Graveston and they performed a fantastic job in organising and resourcing the Junior teams. Sadly, the Club will be losing Hugh's input in 2020 as he heads off to begin a working career. A huge thank you to Hugh for all his work in 2019 and in seasons past, he has been a great contributor to the Club. Also, a huge thanks to all the parents for their support throughout the season and the enthusiastic group of great young coaches that run the practices and game time for the teams. We can always use more support in this area so if there are any members or parents keen to be involved with coaching or managing a junior side please let Kurt or Michael know.

A special congratulations to those chosen for representative teams in 2019, not least the 5 boys selected for Hatch Cup where they finished a credible 3rd place. However, 2020 is the last season of such representative honours for the Juniors as Hockey NZ looks to move to a model of having fun and player development through quality delivery of the sporting experience from Clubs such as ours, and less focus on winning and early selection of talented players. This it is believed will create a culture of enjoyment leading to more youth staying involved in team sports longer and will require the support of administrators, coaches and parents for it to be successful. Again, thank you to all those involved in our junior section; from players and parents through to the wonderful coaching and umpire volunteers, you were all a credit to the Avon Hockey Club in 2019.

In the Senior section our club entered a Division 2 men's side which gave the Avon Hockey Club representation in every grade across both men's and women's competitions. This milestone for the Club is something I am very proud of and marks a coming of age for the Avon Club. Not surprisingly our CPL teams reflected our newfound strength with their results, the men making the semi-final and equipping themselves well ending 4th in the competition and the women narrowly missing out on the finals in the last round to finish strongly in 5th position. With the improving depth of players we are in good fettle for an exciting CPL season in 2020 and I encourage club members to get along and support our premiere teams on Saturday afternoons whenever possible. The only Avon team to win its grade was the Grass men who defended their title, congratulations to those men. Congratulations also to all the Avon members who represented Canterbury in 2019 and the Avon coaches who made themselves available to assist with the development of these representative players and of course our umpires who officiated at all levels of national tournaments.

I would like to thank the committee who worked hard to enable the smooth running of the 2019 season. A special mention goes to Zoe Pullar, Women's Club Captain, who was awarded the Ross Gillespie Trophy in 2019 for her outstanding contribution to the club. Zoe and Ari in their respective Club Captain's roles were a large part of the success of the 2019 season, they were both on top of their responsibilities with good planning and great execution. We have a very capable group of volunteers that make this club function, but we are always on the lookout for more help. Please commit to assisting wherever possible or just make things as easy as possible for those trying to get a job done. We often need people to step up as coaches or managers as our club grows so please come forward if this is something that may interest you. Another busy season for Robin Cox with the secretarial work, dealing with registrations and CHA throughout the season. I am pleased to report our financial position continues to strengthen under the guidance of Kurt Gurden as Treasurer who puts in many hours during and outside the season managing our cash and reporting. Our financial position has remained positive over the year in an ever-tougher funding environment. A huge thank you to our sponsors and the charitable trusts that do support us, and we should look to support them in return if at all possible throughout the year: Hair Art & Beauty, Helloworld Travel Fendalton, Orbit Protect, and Robbies Riccarton should all be high in your priority services lists.

Avon continues its path to be the club of choice. We enjoyed a terrific club day that brought together players from across the grades and long-time supporters. Issy Thomson ran further successful quiz nights. We celebrated with a fantastic attendance at the annual prize giving dinner underpinning the strength of the 2019 season enjoyed by the Club.

Unapologetic, I wish to repeat everything I stated last year; from the side lines I experienced a season that carried with it a lot of enjoyment, teamwork and competitive spirit by members throughout their respective teams and competitions. For Avon Hockey Club to be recognised as the most enjoyable club to play for starts with our conduct, and our supporters conduct, off the field; being positive right through to the detail of communication among team mates around all facets of our sport, on-field, off-field, at training or in a social environment. I expect players to compete hard but play fair, to be restrained in any comments to officials and be respectful towards other players. Treasurer's Report

It was pleasing to report on a reasonably strong financial year for the club. The committee and our volunteers have worked during it to introduce new teams and strengthen the clubs numbers. Financially, the more teams we add, the more money we have to source to fund the losses we make on those teams. However were also able to fill most teams to full numbers which helps stem the losses via subs.

We are very grateful to our continued sponsorship from H&B, helloWorld Fendalton and Orbit Protect who are naming sponsors on our CPL and Platinum teams. We also welcomed Robbies Riccarton onboard who a huge amount of sponsored jackets and junior player of the day certificates, as well as providing a social place to hang out after games.

We also thank One Foundation, Pub Charity and Lion Foundation, who supported our very expensive training and match costs. We also thank NZCT who sponsored another 70 junior uniforms for the club. We are very appreciative of all your support of the club.

Financially, we had a strong year, helped in large by the fact that we were not charged any junior turf hire costs for the use of the old Shirley Boys High School turf, due to the MOE taking over the site. This saved significant cost although did mean we had to return \$5k of a One Foundation grant received for the turf use. The club's cash position has grown to just over \$50k however it only takes one tough year for the financial pressure to come on again.

As we look to the 2020 hockey year, we have identified need for new senior uniforms which we have put in an application for. We have also applied for support with our turf and match fees, so that e can keep subs at a manageable level. At current, we sit in the low-medium amount for subs, in comparison to our fellow hockey clubs.

I want to thank the continued support of the Avon Hockey committee who work tirelessly behind the scenes for our members to make our club the club of choice to play for. We are looking forward to the 2020 hockey season!

Junior Club Co-ordinator's Report

2019 Teams

We had a total of 119 junior members this season, spread over 11 teams and a Fun Sticks programme. We were very top-heavy this year with five teams (or 62 players) in the Kwik Stick grade (years 7-8). 49 of these players were in year 8, and consequently they will be moving up to senior grades in 2020. In the Kiwi Stick grade (years 5-6) we fielded four teams, and in the Mini Stick grade (years 3-4) we fielded two. The lower numbers in the younger grades reflects a real need to attract more players in the Fun Stick and Mini Stick grades. The large number of year 8 players also reflects the large influx of Kiwi Stick players in 2016.

All teams practised on Thursday nights at the old Shirley Boys' High School turf. Each team had a onehour slot between 4:30 and 8:30pm. There were some challenges created by the departure of SBHS from the site, and by the take-over by the Ministry of Education. Nevertheless, we managed to complete the season with relatively little interruption.

Representative Selections

We had an impressive number of representative players selected in 2019. Vivek Lallu, Raj Ravji, Marcus Elson, Ben Murphy, and Finn McCormick-Young were all selected in the Canterbury Primary A Boys Hatch Cup team. Caleb Moore and Freddie Winsor were both selected for the Canterbury Primary B Boys.

Ray Sun, Caleb Knight, and Jackson Taylor were named selected for the Canterbury Development Boys' teams which competed in the Festival of Hockey in Cromwell. Caley van der Kroon was selected in one of the Canterbury Development Girls' teams which competed in the Festival of Hockey in Oamaru.

It must also be mentioned that our very own Kurt Gurden was Assistant Coach to the Canterbury Primary A Boys Hatch Cup team.

Umpiring

This year we continued out umpiring arrangement with HSOB/Burnside, in which we officiated at Rangi Ruru Girls' School on Saturday mornings. We had six young umpires this season, although the large combined number of HSOB/Burnside umpires and umpires from out club meant that we were unable to offer our umpires games every week as we had in previous years. Nevertheless, our umpires grew in confidence over the season, and some of them will certainly be some outstanding umpires in the future. Thank you, Michael, for your work as Umpire Co-ordinator.

Mentoring Umpires

As part of the umpiring arrangement with HSOB/Burnside we regularly provided three umpire mentors to mentor our young umpires. With Division 1 joining CPL on Saturdays, we lost a number of our mentors from previous years, leaving us with three mentors: Kurt Gurden, Michael Graveston, and myself. Considering our other hockey responsibilities, this created some strain on us. Most notably this prevented me, as Junior Club Captain, from getting about and watching many of our teams. While the service is very beneficial for the development of umpires, we will have to consider whether we can afford to continue investing our time here.

2019 Summer Hockey

With 104 people enrolled with our club at all levels, Summer Hockey continued to be very popular among our club members in 2019.

Our Coaches

Although we had an increase in player numbers, we actually had a decrease in the number of teams. This meant we had fewer coaches overall. We had two new coaches this season: Karen Smith, who took the Kwik Stick 11 a-side girls' Stars team with Tania Dons; Alex Brandrick, who assisted Paula Winsor with the Kiwi Stick 6 a-side girls' Blitz team. All of our other coaches had coached at least one season with us prior to 2019.

Thanks to all our coaches for the hours they put in. Coaching is a challenging job, so well done on your efforts.

As I have mentioned already, it was a struggle for me to get around the games on Saturday mornings, and consequently I felt that some of our coaches were occasionally left without support in difficult situations. This is certainly something that the Junior Club intends to address in 2020.

Thanks to Anna Morgan for running an excellent Coaching Workshop for our coaches this season.

In 2019 we formed a Junior Committee to help share some of the burden of governing the club. I sincerely thank Yateen Lallu, the Junior Boys' Captain, Paula Winsor, the Junior Girls' Captain, Michael Graveston, the Umpire Co-ordinator and Administrator, Tania Dons, the Managers' Co-ordinator, and Kurt Gurden. Thank you, Paula, for your work organising a Junior Club Day at Robbies, Riccarton. And thank you, Mark at Robbies, for providing us with Player of the Day certificates. Thanks to Rachel Vavasour for her work as Scoremaster, and thanks to those who helped with uniforms and the Whittaker's chocolate fundraiser.

Looking Ahead

There will be some considerable changes in 2020. Following my resignation in February 2020, the role of Junior Club Captain shall be shared equally between Yateen Lallu and Paula Winsor, Junior Boys' Captain and Junior Girls' Captain respectively. Both Paula and Yateen are excellent coaches with fresh ideas, who, I am sure, will lead the Junior Club forward in a positive direction.

Numbers will be lower in 2020 compared to 2019, so there will be renewed emphasis in attracting players –particularly at the Fun Sticks and Mini Sticks levels.

We have recently been advised that the old Shirley Boys' High School turf will be unavailable in 2020, so we are currently looking at using the new SBHS and Avonside Girls' High School turf from 6-8pm on Thursdays for practices. We are also considering making use of the indoor facilities at the Lions Gym at 81 Bickerton St for our Fun Sticks and Mini Sticks.

We shall shortly be running free preseason trainings at Christchurch Girls' High School, and we are looking into the use of the Heja app as a team management tool.

Club Objectives

- f) To provide social activities for its members.
- g) To undertake all things that are incidental to achieving these objectives.

Club Structure

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is comprised of a committee of 13 voluntary persons, including key positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Men's/Women's/Junior Club Captains, with all other positions being general committee positions. The club operates with the assistance of volunteer coaches and managers.

The Club operates under two divisions, being senior and junior club. The senior club operates under the oversight of the committee and offers hockey in both men's and women's grades as well as youth grade. Categories include; strategic planning for success, looking after volunteers, growing our club, developing our coaches, developing our umpires, playing the game, our facilities/equipment, looking after our members.

Clubmark accreditation has three different levels – gold, silver, and bronze. The higher the level achieved, the better a club has demonstrated their ability to meet the KPIs set out as part of the programme. 1 Statement of Accounting Policies

This is the performance report of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated. The club is an incorporated society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 by a deed dated 22 May 2001.

The Club has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the performance report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The performance report is prepared on the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Measurement System

This performance report has been prepared on a historical cost basis. The performance report is presented in New Zealand dollars (NZ\$).

Particular Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the club in the preparation of this performance report.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realisable value.

Grants

Grants received are recognised in operating revenue unless specific conditions are attached to a grant and repayment of the grant is required where these conditions are not met. In these cases, the grant is treated as a liability until the conditions are met.

Goods and Services Tax

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

Plant, Property and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are recognised at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation rates are disclosed in the asset schedule.

Taxation

The club meets the tax exemptions of section CW 46 in the Income Tax Act 2007 and therefore is not subject to payment of income tax.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

ISRE (NZ) 2400 requires us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the performance report, taken as a whole, is not prepared in all material respects in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Standards Simple Format Reporting Standard – Accrual (Not-For-Profit). This Standard also requires us to comply with ethical standards requirements.

A review of the performance report in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 is a limited assurance engagement. The assurance practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries, primarily of those responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on the performance report.

Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner, we have no relationship with, or interests in, the Club.

Other information in the Performance Report

The Club's rules state the financial statements of the Club are to be audited or reviewed annually, there is no statutory audit requirement therefore our review report does not make any statement in regard to the information presented in the statement of service performance or entity information.

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

As is common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over cash receipts from fundraising activities prior to being recorded is limited and consequently, we were unable to perform the procedures we considered necessary. In this respect alone, we have not been able to obtain all the information and explanations that we have required.

Qualified Conclusion

Based on our review, except for the effect of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Conclusion, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the performance report on pages 4 to 9 does not fairly present in all material respects, the financial position of the Club for the year ending 31 October 2019 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting Standard – Accrual (Not-For-Profit).
